funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time

**Provision**

The range of provision Governors may consider includes:

- Reducing class sizes through additional teacher support, thus improving opportunities for effective Assessment for Learning and accelerating progress
- Providing small group work with a trained teaching assistant, focussed on overcoming gaps in learning
- 1-1 support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through trained TAs or external agencies
- Funding 3 day residential visit to Robinwood to broaden the pupils experiences and to develop their confidence.
