How to uncover a Soupee bird

Are you mesmerised by the rare Soupee bird? Would you love to photograph this magnificent creature up close? If so, read on to find out how!

What you need:

- A long rope
- A net full of chocolate buttons
- Classical music (saved on your phone or iPod)
- Perfume that smells like flowers
- Dry leaves from the jungle
- A good camera

What you do:

- 1. First, trek deep into the jungle where the trees are dense.

 Always make sure you wear sturdy boots to do this.
