- ★ You can add detail to your sentences by using the simple joining words and or but. For example:
 - 1. I trudged through the dense forest and collected samples of the plant life.
 - 2. I tried to catch a fish but they were too fast for me.

Add in 'When'

★ The log uses sentence signposts to tell the reader when something happened in the journey. The ones used in the log are known technically as 'fronted adverbials' – adverbs (or phrases beginning with adverbs) that are placed at the front of sentences to show us WHEN. These include: First, Next, After that, Then, Afterwards, After a while, Finally,

When ... ,

For example:

- 1. Next, I trekked to a clearing and found a beautiful plunge pool.
- 2. Finally, I headed back to camp because the sun began to set.
