

Verbs with 'have'



You can use the **present** form of the verb 'to **have**' to talk about something that happened recently.

The verb after 'to have' is **often** in its **past tense** form, but not always.

Tony **has asked** Yvonne.

I **have seen** it. (not 'I have **saw** it')
