Strictly speaking, the endings are -ion and -ian. Clues about whether to put t, s, ss or c before these endings often come from the last letter or letters of the root word. -tion is the most common spelling. It is used if the root word ends in t (invent) or te (hesitate). -ssion is used if the root word ends in ss or -mit.
