26 Paragraphs

A paragraph is a group of sentences about one main idea. Having paragraphs in stories makes it easier for the reader to follow. We often start a new paragraph in a story when the time changes.



Anna climbed out of bed as soon as Paragraph 1 her alarm went off. It was six o'clock and she had a lot of work to do on the farm. She got washed and dressed and went downstairs. It was half-past-six and Anna had Paragraph 2 finished her cup of tea. She put on her coat and went to milk the cows. An hour later, Anna was feeding the Paragraph 3 chickens. She scattered the corn on the ground and the chickens pecked hungrily. Next, Anna had to let the horses out Paragraph 4 into the field so they could gallop about. At nine o'clock, her mother called her in Paragraph 5 for breakfast. Anna could smell the fresh bread as she took off her boots.
