Verbs are doing words.

Past tense verbs tell us what people, animals and things did.

To make the past tense, we usually add ed or d to the verb

family name.

I knocked on the door

He opened the door.

I walked inside.

We can also make the **past** tense like this.

I was knocking.

There is another past tense.



This is the past simple tense.



This is the past progressive tense.



This is called the **perfect tense**.
